
### VideoMarathon Center for Contemporary Art, Chisinău [ksa:k]



The tradition of its organization dates back to 1997, when in its first edition, the form that would become regular - the KSAK VIDEO MARATHON - a whole night (10-12 uninterrupted hours) of recent examples of contemporary alternative audiovisual creation gathered from all over the world was foreshadowed. The quality and non-commercial nature of the works make them almost inaccessible to the Moldovan public, therefore, the Center for Contemporary Art, making use of its resources and experience in the field of organization and access to the international artistic field, strives to be close to all those wishing to see what is newest and most interesting in contemporary world art, orienting large audience trough the complex universe of contemporary visual arts and stimulate those who want to make video art.

The first editions mainly presented Western audiovisual works, this fact reflecting the relative poverty of the local video scene but also the huge artistic potential in the field from countries with tradition. The years have passed and we can already talk about a considerable increase in the interest of local artists in the field of video – an interest manifested also by a visible increase in the number of works made in Moldova and presented in prestigious festivals and contests all over the world.

"...Video room of the Alliance Française, a young girl asks in Romanian what time the presentation starts. A young man answers her in Russian. Classic scene in Moldova. Yet they do not understand each other. Should we see a certain bad faith on their part? No, absolutely not, because can you blame a Muscovite for not speaking Romanian? #### VideoMarathon 1997

An absolute first for Chisinau was the TZARA RERUM NOVARA video art workshop, (September 22 - 2 October, 1997), mentored by Ron Sluik and Reinier Kurpershoek (Netherlands), which culminated with a video art marathon in the night of October 4. The public got the opportunity to know the most representative works done in Eastern and Western Europe. This show would be was impossible without the help of the entire network of Soros Centers for Contemporary Art - our colleagues have had provided the most valuable materials from the archives of their centers. Having started with a demonstration of the Moldovan part of the program at the National Opera and Ballet Theatre Square, Video Art Marathon moved to "Patria" cinema theater and gained its rhythm, strength and lasted throughout the night for 12.5 hours, displaying creative works of video artists from Russia, Eastern -Western Europe, USA. At eight in the morning the spectators were still unwilling to leave. Video materials have been presented by Sluik/Kurpershoek, Martin Shpreenger (Netherlands), Soros Center for Contemporary Art (Chişinău), Virgil Margineanu (Moldova), Irina Grabovan (Moldova), Tatiana Moghilevskaya (Russia).


#### VideoMarathon 1998

La Nuit Blanche video art marathon - Nordic Video Tour.

The second edition of the Video Art Marathon presented to the attention of the interested public a selection of works from five countries: Iceland, Denmark, Sweden, Norway and Finland. The 12 hours of film, inspired by the analysis of the artistic environment in Scandinavia, were presented by Seppo RENVALL (Finland), artist whose works were included in the Marathon program. The event has been organized by Center Soros for Contemporary Art, Chisinau in partnership with Nordic Institute of Contemporary Art, Helsinki.

With the non-stop 12 hours of video art the Soros Center for Contemporary Art announced the third edition of the Video Art Marathon, Experimental Film and Artistic Clip. This year an anthology of films was presented to him/the experimental video from the 1920s-60s in the unique collection of William Moritz from Hollywood, USA.

Spectators have had the unique opportunity to watch the original Dadaist

version of the film BALLET MECANIQUE; the restored version with the original music - ENTRACTE; other films by Germanie Dulac, Man Ray, etc. Another division of the same collection was the program THE ABSOLUTE CINEMA – experimental film/video art from Ruttman and Fischinger – to Jordan Belson, James Whitney.

The works of contemporary artists started with the manual ones of Sistiaga – up to the computerized ones of Larry Cuba. For this event the



authors have offered a series of films by Dara Birnbaum and the film "Dundy Dust" by Hans Scheirl. The program was followed by presentation of feminist video art from Central and Eastern Europe – from collections of Tatiana Moghilevskaia (RUS) and Ilona Nemeth (SK). The marathon was completed by retrospective of video/film art from the Republic of Moldova. Young artists who explored video camera artistic possibilities had the opportunity to present their creativity to a large audience. After the event the CSAC archive was completed with 10 hours of valuable video art.

The fourth edition of the night of video art and experimental film screenings, organized by Center for Contemporary Art, Chisinau KSA:K had some important milestones: a presentation of the

recent Danish video crop, offered by the Danish Video Art Data Bank; contemporary production of some important university centers in the field of Arts (Beaux-Arts) from France: Valence, Paris and Lyon, Inso –presented by invited artists and media professionals: Dominique Chesquiere GUILLON and Franck CHASTANIER; a video art program from Bulgaria; a compilation of Dutch, Slovenian, British video material etc. selected and presented by Ron SLUIK (Netherlands); a retrospective of the media festivals "DreamCatcher" – presented by Nadya PRIGODICH (Kyiv, Ukraine); Manthos Santorinian (Athens, Greece) presentation of "Medi@terra" video art festival and a medallion of local video art production.





This unique selection of video works, has been received from media artists from all over the world to be screened especially during VideoMarathon Night in Chisinău.

For the six consecutive year, the Center for Contemporary Art, KSA:K, Cinema Odeon and the Alliance Française have joined forces to organize the Video Marathon from November 22 to 24 in Chişinău. This year the Videomarathon was a very special one – it took place over three days, aimed to present the videos of many contemporary artists, at the rate of 5 hours of non-stop projection per day (accompanied by lectures and debates on edge of the video art phenomenon), as opposed to the non-stop 12 hours projections of the previous years. This projection was embellished with the personalized presentation of the work of certain artists

who had traveled from Romania, Ukraine, Russia, Serbia and Croatia for this occasion. We will particularly remember the excellent selection presented by Vladimir Doutchenko, organizer of the

very famous Kansk video Festival in Russia, whose celebrity will perhaps one day overshadow the unmissable French Cannes Festival (which name phonetically sounds similar in Russian language – *Kannskii Festivali*). Finally, let's not forget to mention the presence of many Moldavian artists, in the hall and on the screen of the Odeon, as evidenced by the screening "Shoes for Europe" by Pavel Braila (Moldova). This film between art and documentary deals with the change of tracks between Moldova and Romania, and was commissioned as part of the eleventh edition of Documenta in Kassel.


## VIDEOMARATON 2004

A traditional event, dedicated to the promotion and presentation of contemporary audiovisual culture, the Videomarathon brought the best of video art and the international audiovisual experiment to the local public including a consistent block of local production. The mascot of this edition was video art compilations: "Video on Knee", "Carbon Man" and "Absolute Films" from The Blue Noses Group from Novosibirsk – the most impressive phenomenon at the turn of the 21st century. On December 17 and 18, starting at 19:00, the friendly hall of the "ODEON" cinema hosted the most expected visual culture event in Moldova - the 2004 Videomarathon.

Tur Nomadic – reprezintă un maraton nomad de proiecții, alcătuit din compilații de filme de autor și artă video. Scopul activități Tur Nomadic vizează fenomenul de descentralizare a activităților culturale focusate cu precădere în capitală și ne propunem să trezim curiozitatea față de noile practici de artă contemporană, între comunitățile locale precum și persoanele îndepărtate de locurile de cultură și sociabilitate din diferite regiuni ale Moldovei din nordul, sudul și centrul țării, regiuni transfrontaliere și de a favoriza dialogul intercultural și de a stimula autonomia culturală.





Turul a fost organizat în colaborare cu autoritățile locale (primarii) din regiune, partenerii proiectului KunsTraeume-Alternative Spaces (Moldova și Ucraina), Coaliția Sectorului Cultural Independent (în cadrul Zilelor Spațiilor Culturale Alternative), Centrul de Proiecte Culturale Arta Azi (în cadrul proiectului "Arta în mahalale" — platformă rurală pentru educație prin cultură) și platforma CULTURA - Poduri de încredere peste Nistru. A fost un maraton nomad de proiecții, desfășurat pe parcursul unei seri în fiecare locație, compus din selecții (3-4 ore) din programul VideoMaraton'23, însoțit de mici discuții de tip panel, care au fost transmise în Casele de Cultură, în aer liber și/sau în cinematografele locale din 8 regiuni ale Republicii Moldova. Selecțiile și echipamentul necesar (dacă este cazul) au fost aduse din Chișinău de către un grup format din curatorul turului și experți invitați.

Filmele realizate în laboratorul reVedere'23 din satul Naslavcea au fost incluse în programul proiecțiilor din a treia etapă a turului din august 2023 (satul Naslavcea, raionul Ocnița; orașul Soroca; satul Văratic, raionul Rîscani), stârnind astfel interesul tinerilor de a participa la editiile viitoare.
